Since the start of the pandemic, charities, non-profit organizations and First Nations governments have been leading the charge to assist those who need it most in the fight against COVID-19. The Killarney Foundation participated in The Emergency Community Support Fund, a federal granting program facilitated by Community Foundations of Canada. Our local Foundation was able to grant \$70,000.00 to several worthwhile causes in the community to assist them in these Covid times. Grant recipients included Killarney Handi-Van, New Horizons Drop-In Centre, Services for Seniors, Tri-Lake Health Centre, Tri-Lake Palliative Care, Killarney Food Bank, Killarney Turtle Mountain Arts Council and Killarney Collegiate.

DOLLARS WORKING FOR THE COMMUNITY

Designated Hospital Funds include the Tri-Lake Hospital Fund, R.W. Church Hospital Fund, Irene Wild Palliative Care Fund, and David Hendry Estate Hospital Fund. To date, over \$795,000.00 has been granted to our local hospital for numerous medical equipment purchases, ultrasound, beds, Handi-Van, X-ray table and shields, just to name a few.

Killarney Hospital have been collaborating over the last three years on a project with the Prairie Mountain Health Region to renovate all of the Acute Care Washrooms. We are happy to report that we are 50% completed and expect to have the rest of the project completed by end of January 2021. The renovated washrooms include making them wheelchair accessible with an enlarged door frame, installed new fixtures, flooring, counter tops, toilet, sink, bars, mirror and painting of complete room.

Like any initiative this large, it takes a whole team to bring it across the finish line. We acknowledge and thank the following for their generous donations: Hy-Life (\$100,000.00 donation); B.P.O. Elks (\$5,000.00 donation); and the numerous generous donations from our amazing community.
